Review of Literature

A typical parenthetical reference consists of the author's last name followed by a comma and the year of publication.

Many people exhibit symptoms of depression after the death of a pet (Russo, 2000).

If the author's name appears in the introductory phrase, include just the year of publication.

According to Russo (2000), many people exhibit symptoms of depression after the death of a pet.

Do not add a parenthetical citation if all relevant information is included elsewhere in the sentence.

In 2000, Russo discussed the relationship between depression and the death of a pet.

Reference List

Include only the sources that were used in preparing the *Review of Literature*.

The *Reference List* should be alphabetized according to the first letter of each entry; it must be double-spaced, and entries should be formatted using a hanging indent.

Typing Tip: Turn off automatic hyphenate and automatic hyperlink.
go to FORMAT > Paragraph > line and page > click Don't hyphenate
go to TOOLS > AutoCorrect > Auto Format As You Type > unclick Internet paths

The correct style to use for citing references in the *Reference List* section is discussed in detail in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*, 5th ed., 2001.

(Be aware that there are small differences for IJAS from APA 5th edition.)

Types of Sources of Information

Book : Basic form

Author. (Publication date). *Title of book*. Publisher's location: Name of Publisher.

Book – One author:

Day, R. A. (2001). *How to write & publish a scientific paper* (4th ed.). Phoenix, AZ: The Oryx Press.

Book - Multiple authors:

When a work has two to six authors, cite all authors. When a work has more than six authors, cite the first six authors followed by et al. to indicate the remaining authors.

Journal article, Online: Basic form

Author. (Date). Title. Journal Title [Publication medium], volume:issue (if given), paging. Available: URL (Protocol:Site/Path/File) [Access date].
